On the last Thursday of every month, we put up a show of **three brand new short plays** centered around an **audience-proposed theme**, featuring an open bar.


Tickets are pay-what-you-want and the shows run for one night and one night only to sold out crowds of 200+ people.


Over half of our writers were audience members who responded to our monthly call for submissions... and the majority had never written for theater before.

So far our shows have united audiences all over Northeast and Central LA and we plan to continue pushing into neighborhoods not previously associated with theater.






Not a moment wasted, not an opportunity overlooked. I don't know how they put out this extraordinary level of work on this ambitious timeline.










